Hurricane Ida

Thankfully, there was no loss of life in St. John when Hurricane Ida, one of the most powerful hurricanes in history, struck our community. We continue to re-build from the tremendous damage inflicted from wind, rain and high water.

"We did all we could to help residents evacuate or prepare for the storm," Sheriff Tregre said. "We doubled the number of personnel on patrol before it hit and got back out on the roads as soon as we could once the wind died down."

Hundreds of people were rescued from their homes by the SJBPSO as fast-rising water caused widespread flooding. One person saved was trapped under a fallen tree.

"Many residents are still repairing homes and businesses and some dishonest people are taking advantage of the situation," Sheriff Tregre said. "Before agreeing to any work or signing a contract, check references and call us with questions."



We prepared and delivered many meals for residents, first responders, utility workers and volunteers.

New West Bank Public Safety Complex

The West Bank Public Safety Complex at the foot of the Veterans Memorial Bridge is open and meeting the needs of residents in that community.

"We teamed with parish government to build this outstanding facility that allows us to increase manpower in that area and ensure faster response times," Sheriff Tregre said. "Sharing the building with the Office of Fire Services saves taxpayer money and makes coordinating aid easier."

The \$2.2 million, 6,000-square-foot building moves sheriff's office personnel from cramped quarters at the Edgard courthouse. There is storage space for boats, four wheelers and search and rescue equipment. The complex will also serve as a voting location.

Service Before Self Award



Detective Keniel Henry has received the top honor — the Service Before Self Award — from Beyond the Badge, a volunteer group that works to inform the public about law enforcement officers performing extraordinary acts of kindness in their Louisiana communities. Detective Henry was also one of 15 officers in the state to receive the group's Heart of Law Enforcement award.

Each year, Detective Henry and his family start a grocery list to prepare meals for people in need. On his birthday in July, they cook and deliver the food to homeless people in the New Orleans area, paying for everything himself.

In 2020, Detective Henry also began a drive to collect blankets, gloves and warm clothes for the homeless. He and his family as well as community members deliver the items each January.

Medal of Valor



Deputy Elton Breaux was honored with the Medal of Valor for his work in stopping the active shooter incident with Deputy of the Year Detective Walker. This award is given to an officer who performed a brave attempt to rescue someone from suffering severe bodily harm or the loss of life, or committing an act requiring great courage in the face of life-threatening danger. Despite being off-duty and traveling with his family, Deputy Breaux responded to the extremely serious situation and provided cover for one victim, getting him to safety while the shooter was located and apprehended.
